Advising	Students will have advisors in English, Communication Studies, and the College of Education.			
Program Notes	Because so many of the courses are two- or four-credit courses, and because some courses are offered only once a year, and because the student teaching semester is limited to twelve credits, the number of credits per semester varies: term 1, 15 credits; term 2, 16; term 3, 14; term 4, 15; term 5, 17; term 6, 14; term 7, 17; term 8, 12.
