Program Description:

Economics aims to provide the student with the basic materials and tools of analysis used to understand our present economic system, and to organize data for decision-making purposes in both short and long-range planning. It is designed to help those contemplating business or other careers as well as those who are preparing to teach in the social studies.

Admission Requirements:

Students enrolling in 300-400 level courses must be admitted to the program. Admission is granted by the department. Minimum university admission requirements are:

- a minimum of 32 earned semester credit hours.
- a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00 ("C").

Term 8 Notes:

ECON 482W is a time intensive writing and research course. A minimum of a "C" grade is required in each of the five courses that are prerequisites for the course, ECON 207, ECON 301, ECON 355, ECON 356, and ECON 462.

Students can take upper-division courses (300 or 400 level classes) in their respective minor areas of study.

To be eligible for graduation with a bachelor's degree, a student is required to have completed at least 40 credits of upper-division (300-400) courses. Following this degree map, a BA major will have completed 27 credits in upper-division courses in the required core and unrestricted elective classes at the end of term 8. Students should add up how many upper-division courses they have earned in their major and minor areas. If that number falls below 40, students should consider taking upper-division courses in either General Education, Economic Electives, or Minor Electives.

PROGRAM NOTES

A minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 is required for all courses taken in the required economics core courses and required economics electives for the economics BA major.
